


PAUL MALESKEY

College students in teacher training programs must go through a period of student teaching. In the early 1960's, many of the students at local colleges heard the name Paul Maleskey in connection with student teaching at William Allen High School. Paul was designated a master teacher. He was a mentor who guided these eager and inexperienced teachers through the first throws of classroom instruction. Paul was the person to watch to pick up teaching techniques, and he was also the person to have as a master teacher if you wanted a good recommendation to get a job when you graduated.

During the time of master teacher-student teacher relationship, you began to get a glimpse of the complex nature of Paul Maleskey. He loved nature, and he spent many weekends hiking and backpacking around the country. He would document his outings with photographs, and he introduced an artistry into his photos which became his style.

When Lehigh County Community College opened its doors, Paul was there as *THE* Chemistry Department. He continually promoted the Chemical Technology program to local industries and was responsible for many careers in the field. His job was teaching chemistry and he loved it. When Paul taught, he challenged you, and he pushed you until you realized capabilities in yourself you didn't think you had.



Paul had many successful students, but some of his greatest joys occurred when graduates returned to LCCC to tell him of their successes and to thank him for getting them started.

To say that Paul Malesky left something of himself behind when he left us is an understatement. The students whom he taught now have careers. Instructors who watched him or were coached by him are now better because of his influence. And his friends and family were enriched by his presence.




JIM ROTH

Professionalism and complexity of personality characterized Jim Roth. The former was revealed by his professional involvement as a community college accounting professor. The latter was revealed by the impact of his personality.

Jim's professionalism was evidenced in three areas: 1) his preferred area of academic interest, accounting; 2) his emphasis on student accomplishment and advisement; and 3) his involvement in faculty conerns. For years, in addition to teaching accounting, Jim did accounting work, attended seminars about accounting subjects, and participated in professional accounting organizations in which he involved his students in recognition programs.

Prior to teaching, he was employed in several different business positions from which he acquired experience which embellished his teaching. He expected his students to be able to understand and perform accounting work. As an academic adviser of students, he was concerned and thorough. He advocated mandatory complete advisement from admissions through orientation and follow-up. From its inception Jim actively supported the faculty association and criticized it.



The impact of Jim's personality was felt by all his associates. He was an idealist burdened with the associated expectations. He strove, sometimes in dynamic fashion, for the realization of those expectations. Consequently, he was often engaged in controversy, appreciated and deprecated, but never ignored. Fortunately, his sense of humor, often self-deprecating, was sustaining.


To those who knew him well he was entertaining, giving, endowed with immense curiosity and broad interests. He was exceptionally knowledgeable about travel in Pennsylvania, food, the best places to eat, and the associated direct money costs.

Further insight into Jim's personality may be gleaned from these revelations. 1) Jim was greatly interested in the United States Navy. This interest was due to his past involvement and the present involvement of his son. 2) A former student in Jim's classes emphasized his compelling attitude, attention to detail, and thoroughness in teaching. 3) Family was important to Jim. He believed a mother should be at home with her children during their early formative years, and fathers should be held accountable for their children. 4) Sports were important to Jim. In his opinion, due to affective carryover in life, individual sports activities were to be preferred to team sports. 5) He believed his lack of self-discipline was the major cause of his physical ailments. In his words, "I've got by with it longer than most." 6) He professed a belief in God or a creator. 7) His two favorite sayings were: "I came into this world with nothing and I'll go out of this world with nothing," and "It only costs a little more to go first class."
