Honors College Guest Lecture Set for Nov. 9

The campus community is invited to the Honors College's Drs. Adelle and Richard Ziemer Lecture on Wednesday, Nov. 9, from 2:30 to 3:45 p.m. in the Alumni Center. Wazhmah Osman will present "Beyond the Veil: Making Sense of Women's Rights and Social Movements in Afghanistan and Iran."

Wazhmah Osman is an Afghan-American filmmaker and associate professor in media studies and production at Temple University. She is the author of Television and the Afghan Culture Wars: Brought to You by Foreigners, Warlords, and Activists (University of Illinois Press, 2020). She is also the co-director of Postcards from Tora Bora (Documentary Educational Resources, 2007) and the co-author of the forthcoming Afghanistan: A Very Short Introduction (Oxford University, forthcoming). She has appeared as a commentator on Democracy Now, NPR, and Al Jazeera and works with community and activist groups.

New Public Safety Officers Hired

The college has contracted with Allied Universal to hire two additional full-time security guards to assist with patrolling on the main campus in Schnecksville. These public safety officers will be wearing Allied uniforms. The officers will work Monday through Friday on the 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. shift and the 12 to 8 p.m. shift. This hybrid approach to public safety will allow the college to utilize part-time officers to fill in the gaps at the sites, where it has been a challenge to employ part-time officers. Both of the Allied officers will be dedicated to LCCC, not alternating with different people. The one-year contract will begin when background clearances are completed. These officers will serve in the same capacity as LCCC security officers.

ASD Students Have Debt-Free Pathway to Associate Degree Thanks to Grant



At a news conference on Thursday, Lehigh Carbon Community College and PA Senator Pat Browne announced the awarding of a \$106,000 grant to support a collaboration between LCCC and the Allentown School District (ASD). These funds come from a grant obtained by Senator Browne through the 2022-23 budget process.

The Tuition- and Debt-Free College Pathway initiative will provide an opportunity for 25 at-promise ASD Early College students to earn an associate degree from LCCC without

incurring the cost of a college education. In combination with additional sources, these funds will pay for tuition, as well as a \$500 textbook allowance for two years. Participating students who complete their degree at LCCC can then transfer to a college or university to complete their bachelor's degree. This pathway is streamlined through the 600+ articulation agreements LCCC has with 63 colleges and universities in Pennsylvania and nationwide.

ASD Early College students earning their high school diploma and college degree simultaneously are eligible for this pathway scholarship. Full-time students will start at LCCC in fall 2023 and are expected to complete their associate degree by the end of academic year 2025-26.

"This partnership is an example of the college's commitment to student success, creating an innovative pathway for students to earn their high school diploma and associate's degree without incurring debt," says LCCC President Dr. Ann D. Bieber. "ASD students will be able to fully realize their dreams of a college education."

"A skilled and talented workforce continues to be the bedrock of the American economy," Senator Browne said. "This program will help to ensure that our students have new pathways to obtain a high-quality education which will put them on the path to success. I want to thank LCCC for their commitment to the students of Allentown and for providing these outstanding opportunities."

Title IX for Higher Education Training

As part of the college's annual sexual violence awareness trainings, this year's Title IX online training will be provided by Knowbe4 and will consist of three separate online training sessions.

Knowbe4 is a single sign-on system that will enable to you log in using your portal username and password.

This training is mandatory for all employees and must be completed annually. The deadline for completing all

three trainings is Friday, November 18, 2022. Below is the schedule that you will be notified via email from Knowbe4 of the following trainings:

Date to receive email notification from Knowbe4:

1. October 17, 2022 - Title IX Part 2: Recognizing Misconduct (approx.11 minutes in length) October 24, 2022 - Title IX Part 3: Reporting and Response (approx. 14 minutes in length)

All three online trainings must be completed by November 18, 2022. Your participation and completion of these trainings will be automatically logged by the Knowbe4 system.

Slip, Trip and Fall Prevention

Slips, trips, and falls account for a large percentage of medical incidents on campus and are the result from some a kind of unintended or unexpected change in the contact between the feet and the ground or walking surface. Attached are tips to aid in the prevention of slips, trips and falls.

Updated COVID-19 Guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) effective August 11, 2022 can be found here.

This updated guidance no longer differentiates between those who are vaccinated and those who are unvaccinated. The CDC advises that those individuals exposed to COVID-1, regardless of vaccination status, need not quarantine.

1. Exposure to someone with COVID-19:

If you were exposed to someone with COVID-19, follow these steps per the CDC guidelines:

Start precautions immediately:

- Wear a high-quality mask for 10-full days as soon as you find out you were exposed (day 1 is the first full day after your last exposure)
- Get tested at least 5 full days after your last exposure
- Watch for COVID-19 symptoms such as:
 - Fever (100.4 degrees or greater)
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath Other COVID-19 symptoms
- If you develop symptoms, isolate immediately

2. Isolation and Precautions for People with COVID-19.

If you test positive for COVID-19, follow the steps below per the CDC guidelines:

- Stay home and isolate for at least 5 days and isolate from others in your home.
- If you had no symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the following day you were tested.

If you had symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the first full day after the day your symptoms started.

Quick Reference for Medical Emergencies on Campus

If serious injury or illness occurs on campus, CALL 911. After you call 911, call Public Safety at x1169 to inform them you called 911. Public Safety will report to where the injured person is until arrival of the ambulance. For minor injury or illness, trained personnel should provide basic first aid care. Call Public Safety at x1169. All Public Safety officers are trained in first aid and CPR/AEDS.

No employee shall transport another employee/student to an emergency facility or hospital.

2023 Open Enrollment materials have been distributed to all full-time employees and can be found on the intranet under Human Resources.

- If you are making a change to your current plan, please submit your change forms to the Human Resource Office by Nov. 23. The change forms are available on the intranet under Human Resources, Benefits, and Open Enrollment and as an attachment included with the email.
- If you are not making any changes to your dependent coverage, new forms are not required.
- All changes during the open enrollment period are effective Jan. 1, 2023. If you are waiving coverage for the 2023 Plan year, a Waiver of Coverage form is required. (Medical Opt
- Out Benefit for 2023 is \$2,500 effective Jan. 1, 2023.) The Flexible Spending Account Election Form for the 2023 Plan Year is attached and also posted on the
- intranet. Please complete this form if you choose to elect a Section 125-Flexible Spending Account for Calendar year 2023 and return it to the Human Resource Office by Nov, 23. You are not automatically enrolled in the FSA. A 2023 enrollment form is required.

Benefit changes and Flexible Spending Account Election Forms are due to Human Resources no later than Nov. 23. Late submissions cannot be accepted.
