

Nominate a Colleague for Spotlight on Excellence

This updated guidance no longer differentiates between those who are vaccinated and those who are unvaccinated. The CDC advises that those individuals exposed to COVID-1, regardless of vaccination status, need not quarantine.

If you were exposed to someone with COVID-19, follow these steps per the CDC guidelines: Start precautions immediately: Wear a high-quality mask for 10-full days as soon as you find out you were exposed (day 1 is the first full
