 If you develop symptoms, isolate immediately 2. Isolation and Precautions for People with COVID-19.

If you test positive for COVID-19, follow the steps below per the CDC guidelines: Stay home and isolate for at least 5 days and isolate from others in your home. If you had no symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the following day you were tested. If you had symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the first full day after the day your symptoms started.


