Campus Invited to PACCC Annual Meeting Keynote The college community is invited to attend virtually the keynote address for the Pennsylvania Commission for Community College's Annual Meeting. The keynote is scheduled for 2:30-3:30 p.m., Tuesday, April 2. Topic is "Retention Strategies," featuring <u>Tim Renick</u>, Executive Director, National Institute for Student Success, at Georgia State University. There is not fee to view the keynote.

Dr. Renick and his team have made tremendous strides in improving retention at their institution. They achieved a 70% increase in graduation rates and closed all achievement gaps based on race, ethnicity, and income. Georgia State's five affiliated community colleges also increased their graduation rates by 300%. These impressive results led to the creation of the National Institute for Student Success (NISS), which is now working with more than 70 two- and four-year colleges to help them achieve the same results. Dr. Renick will present how they achieved those results and explain how those results increased revenues simultaneously.

Slip, Trip and Fall Prevention

Quick Reference for Medical Emergencies on Campus

If serious injury or illness occurs on campus, CALL 911. After you call 911, call Public Safety at x1169 to inform them you called 911. Public Safety will report to where the injured person is until arrival of the ambulance.

For minor injury or illness, trained personnel should provide basic first aid care. Call Public Safety at x1169. All Public Safety officers are trained in first aid and CPR/AEDS.

No employee shall transport another employee/student to an emergency facility or hospital.

Student Engagement Survey Begins in April



Reminder: Review and Update Your TIAA Beneficiary Information

As part of our ongoing efforts to ensure that your TIAA retirement accounts are well-managed and align with your wishes, I would like to remind you to review and update your beneficiary information for your retirement account.

Life can bring unexpected changes, and it's important to make sure that your retirement savings are designated to the individuals or entities you intend. Whether you've experienced major life events like marriage, divorce, the birth of a child, or if it's been some time since you last reviewed your beneficiary designations, now is an excellent time to ensure your account reflects your current wishes.

Updating your beneficiary information through TIAA is quick and easy to do:

- Go to TIAA.org to register and/or log in to your account. Note: You'll need a user ID and valid email address to sign up.
- Once logged in, under the Action tab, choose Add/Edit beneficiaries.
- From there, you can designate beneficiaries and select how much each should receive.


