

LCCC Announces New Promise Scholarship to Lehigh County Graduates

Recent high school graduates from Lehigh County school districts will have access to additional scholarships thanks to LCCC's new Promise Scholarship Program. The program is funded through the college, which was able to set aside \$2 million to create an endowment from funds originally received for capital improvements.

The scholarships will assist recent high school graduates who qualify for federal Pell grants and who are from the Lehigh County sponsoring school districts of Allentown, Catasauqua, East Penn, Parkland, Northern Lehigh, Northwestern Lehigh, Salisbury, Southern Lehigh and Whitehall-Coplay, as well as students from Lehigh Career and Technical Institute from a sponsoring school district.

The program will begin with the high school graduating class of 2023. Students who enroll at LCCC after high school graduation and pursue an associate degree are eligible. The scholarship will provide up to full-time tuition and fees, after any federal Pell Grant funding, plus \$500 per semester for books and supplies. The scholarship can be applied to fall and spring semesters for two years. Students do not have to meet a grade point minimum for their first semester of the scholarship, but do need to maintain a 2.5 GPA thereafter.

Students must begin the Promise program within the first two years after high school graduation. In addition, students must be registered at LCCC for the fall 2023 semester by May 15 in at least nine credits. The scholarship will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. Award recipients will be notified by June 15.

Students should apply for the Promise Scholarship through the general scholarship application at www.LCCC.edu/scholarships. They must also submit the FAFSA. Deadline to apply is May 1.

Slip, Trip and Fall Prevention

Slips, trips, and falls account for a large percentage of medical incidents on campus and are the result from some a kind of unintended or unexpected change in the contact between the feet and the ground or walking surface. Attached are tips to aid in the prevention of slips, trips and falls.

Updated COVID-19 Guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) effective August 11, 2022 can be found here.

This updated guidance no longer differentiates between those who are vaccinated and those who are unvaccinated. The CDC advises that those individuals exposed to COVID-1, regardless of vaccination status, need not quarantine.

1. Exposure to someone with COVID-19:

If you were exposed to someone with COVID-19, follow these steps per the CDC guidelines:

Start precautions immediately:

- Wear a high-quality mask for 10-full days as soon as you find out you were exposed (day 1 is the first full day after your last exposure)
- Get tested at least 5 full days after your last exposure
- Watch for COVID-19 symptoms such as:
 - Fever (100.4 degrees or greater)
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - Other COVID-19 symptoms
- If you develop symptoms, isolate immediately

2. Isolation and Precautions for People with COVID-19.

- If you test positive for COVID-19, follow the steps below per the CDC guidelines:
- Stay home and isolate for at least 5 days and isolate from others in your home.
- If you had no symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the following day you were tested.
- If you had symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the first full day after the day your symptoms started.

Quick Reference for Medical Emergencies on Campus

If serious injury or illness occurs on campus, CALL 911. After you call 911, call Public Safety at x1169 to inform them you called 911. Public Safety will report to where the injured person is until arrival of the ambulance. For minor injury or illness, trained personnel should provide basic first aid care. Call Public Safety at x1169. All Public Safety officers are trained in first aid and CPR/AEDS.

No employee shall transport another employee/student to an emergency facility or hospital.

LCCC Hosts News Conference to Spotlight Statewide Higher Ed **Partnerships**

Demonstrating a commitment to work together to better serve students and their communities, regional representatives of Pennsylvania community colleges and universities from the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education will hold a news conference at 12 p.m., Monday, April 17, to sign a pledge demonstrating this commitment.

Hosted by Dr. Ann D. Bieber, LCCC president, the ceremony will be held in person in the Technology Center and also virtually. Attending to demonstrate the regional commitment will be Dr. David Ruth, president of Northampton Community College; Dr. Kenneth Hawkinson, president of Kutztown University; and Kenneth Long, president of East Stroudsburg University.

The campus community is invited to attend the news conference virtually.

Speakers will include Dr. Hawkinson as a representative from PASSHE, Dr. Bieber, local state legislators and LCCC student Emma Hope, who is an All-PA Academic Team recipient who is expected to graduate from LCCC in May and plans to transfer to Kutztown University.

The pledge was drafted to demonstrate the commitment to provide high quality affordable academic and career education programs and to contribute to the development of a highly skilled competitive workforce in the Commonwealth. Leadership of statewide community colleges and PASSHE universities have worked

collaboratively to help students achieve their educational goals. Some of the specifics within the pledge include: Ensuring students are aware of all their higher education opportunities

Smoothing the path for students to transfer from a community college to a PASSHE institution Establishing a reverse transfer agreement allowing students to transfer credits from a university back to a

community college

Allocating financial aid at universities for community college graduates Working to ensure the success of community college graduates who transfer to PASSHE universities

"The impact of this pledge will be significant, demonstrating to students in our communities that the path to a higher education is attainable and affordable," says Dr. Ann D. Bieber, president of LCCC. "LCCC is proud to be a partner in this pledge of working together to benefit our students."
