

Tamaqua's Morgan Scholarships at LCCC Have Greatly Expanded the Number of Local College Graduates for 20+ Years!", the article describes the successes of the program since its inception 20 years ago, including the fact that more than 2,200 students have earned associate degrees, certificates and diplomas at LCCC's Tamaqua site. Many of those students took advantage of the Morgan Success Scholarship, which guarantees two years of free tuition for Tamaqua Area High School graduates who attend LCCC. The percentage of Tamaqua Area School District residents who have earned an associate degree has increased by 50% in the past decade. A new study published by the Annenberg Institute at Brown University shows a strong link between this increase and the Morgan Success Scholarship: "All evidence we presented suggests that Tamaqua, Pennsylvania's Morgan Success Scholarship strongly refashions the educational trajectories of many eligible


