

ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATES

Updated COVID-19 Guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) effective August 11, 2022 can be found here. This updated guidance no longer differentiates between those who are vaccinated and those

who are unvaccinated. The CDC advises that those individuals exposed to COVID-1,

regardless of vaccination status, need not quarantine.

Fever (100.4 degrees or greater) Other COVID-19 symptoms

- If you had symptoms, day 1 of isolation is the first full day after the day your symptoms
- person is until arrival of the ambulance. For minor injury or illness, trained personnel should provide basic first aid care. Call Public Safety at x1169.
