











SPOTLIGHT ON Dr. Robin Musselman

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I have my doctorate in Psychoeducational Processes from Temple University so there is a natural tie-in with education, both in terms of teaching and the organizational issues of the institutions. At Temple, I have taught in the College of Education, both undergraduate and graduate classes. I started at LCCC in 1986 as the dean of students and also taught part time in the psychology department. In January 2003 I became a full-time faculty member teaching in the department of social sciences.

I have experience teaching online, face to face, remote (one semester) and hybrid. I have taught learning communities with faculty from biology and English. I also have experience in curriculum development, developing the psychology major and several courses in the program. I have worked with a number of student groups over the years; currently one of my bigger projects is working as the advisor for the Honors in Action project for Phi Theta Kappa.

I have been very fortunate to attend and work on a regional and national level with teaching conferences. I have published instructor resource manuals for undergraduate and graduate textbooks and a test bank for a Social Psychology textbook. I participate in several initiatives through the American Psychological Association, am a contributing author to the new book Transforming Introductory Psychology: Expert Advice on Teacher Training, Course Design and Student Success, and a contributing editor to the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning in Psychology Journal.

I welcome questions about LCCC-specific issues, including preparing for promotion. I have served on the promotion committee over 25 times at LCCC. I have also done extensive work on inclusion and creating student-friendly syllabi.
