

Math Game- Jenna Sloan

- For incorporating nature in the classroom with a math game, I used natural artifacts from outside and then used recycled containers to sort the different materials.
- The materials included are...
 - Pine cones
 - Sticks
 - o Birch logs
 - Tree bark
 - o Feathers
 - Seashells
 - Rocks
- On the tree logs I labeled from 1-20 to have the students count and then
 they can sort the materials and count the materials in each bin. They can
 also compare and contrast as well as feel the textures.
