- Jace Izellah Mary: "Newton's Law of Cooling." Mentored by Joseph Kazan. Empirical Research / Environment panel.

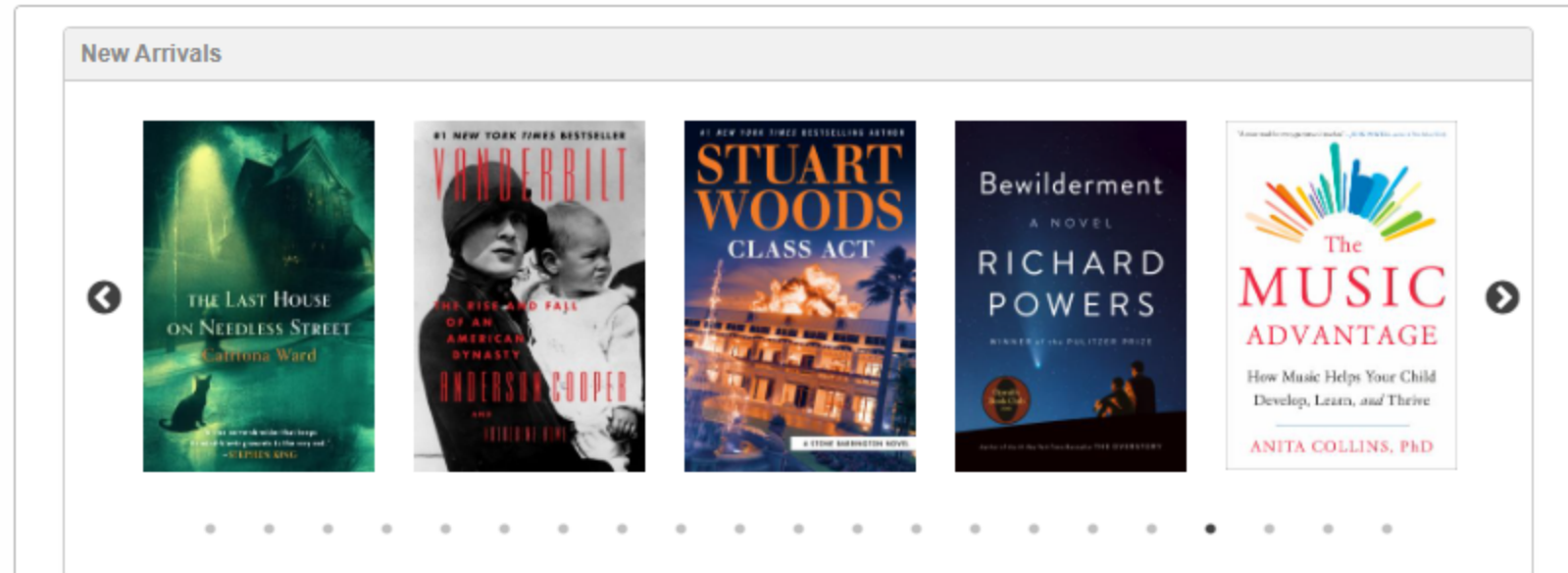
Panel award winners' papers will be published in the conference's *Proceedings*, and each winner and their mentor will receive a monetary honorarium.

U.S. Postal Service Increase

The United States Postal Service® filed notice with the Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) of price changes to take effect July 10, 2022. The new prices, if favorably reviewed, include a two-cent increase in the price of a First-Class Mail Forever stamp from 58 cents to 60 cents.

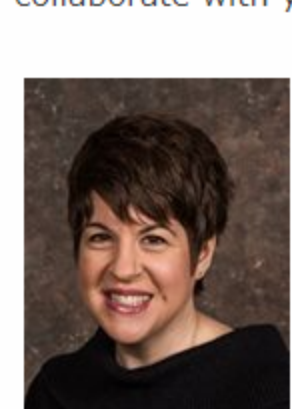

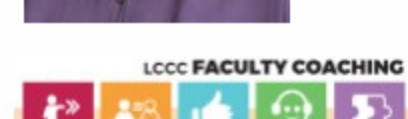

In general, you will be contacted by Brian DeLong, the Director of Counseling and Community Standards, when you submit a report. StART's mission is to maintain a healthy, safe environment for all members of the college community. StART is currently utilized for online reporting of violations of the Codes of Student Conduct (behavior concern), violations of the Academic Honesty Policy (academic dishonesty), injuries that take place during class (course related injury) and Public Safety reports.
