Approaches in Asynchronous Online Discussions on
Student Performance by Jiarui Xie, Mimi Adjei, and
Ana-Paula Correia. The study compares two instructor
participation methods in asynchronous Online discussions:
replying on public discussion boards and commenting on
private grade pages. While the quality and quantity of posts
were similar, private comments shifted students' focus from
social communication to knowledge construction in their
posts.

Canvas Updates & How To

New Canvas Features Coming

Canvas Studio enhanced accessibility, adaptive streaming, and privacy features (Coming 4/19)

Features that are coming to Canvas Studio include:

- 1. The default embed size increased to 480x300px
- 2. The play bar is redesigned and repositioned
- 3. The Closed Caption icon is updated
- 4. Keyboard accessibility is improved with the addition of a hidden shortcut icon
- 5. Privacy measures are enhanced to ensure secure playback
- 6. Video quality automatically adjusts based on available bandwidth
- 7. The ability to upload and delete closed captions



The update enhances the user experience with a consistent interface.


Discussions Default View Settings (Available now)

Instructors can change the default view in the settings of the discussion. You can have thread collapse/expansion and sorting options, and the ability to lock these preferences. The sorting section of the discussion and announcements is redesigned.



Import Content page enhancements (Available now)

The import content page is updated to the latest Canvas User Interface. The import button text has been updated to Add Import to Queue. *Note *Copy a Canvas Course* is the second item on the list options.




How to add a Grade Scheme to your Gradebook before finals


Grade schemes can be added to your course to automatically add a letter grade next to the final

grade in the Gradebook. This makes it easier for you to enter the letter grade into Banner. To add a Grade Scheme to your Gradebook follow the following directions.

- Go to the settings in the course you wish to add the Grade Scheme to. *Note this is a course specific setting.
- Click on the Course Details tab at the top of the settings screen.



- 3. Scroll down until you get to Grade Scheme. Check off the enable course grading scheme box.
- 4. In the drop down under the enable box select from the list the Grade Scheme you wish to use. *Note there are department specific schemes. Check with your department head if you are to use a certain scheme if you need help.
- 5. Make sure to hit Update Course Details after you select the Grade Scheme.
- Now when you click on Grades from your main navigation and scroll over to the total column you will see a letter grade.
