


Prospective Students Invited to LCCC Spring 2024 Open House on April 10

President Bieber Presents to Senate Committees



President Ann Bieber presented to the Senate Communications and Technology Committee and the Senate Community, Economic and Recreational Development Committee during a roundtable held on Feb. 8. The gathering focused on semiconductor production in the Commonwealth and was hosted by Infinera Corporation's Lehigh Valley facility.

Dr. Bieber presented on LCCC's perspective on the workforce and educational pipeline to support the semiconductor and chip manufacturing industry, as well as how LCCC is preparing our workforce, information about our successes and challenges, and how the Commonwealth can support this important industry and economic driver.

LCCC Student Receives Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

LCCC student Marie Victoire Alexis has been selected as a 2023 Oberndorf Lifeline to Completion Scholar from the Phi Theta Kappa honor society and will receive a \$1,500 scholarship. This scholarship is designed to assist Phi Theta Kappa members in overcoming unanticipated financial barriers preventing the completion of the college credential, an associate degree, or certificate while enrolled in college.

Marie is the first Oberndorf Scholar from LCCC. A psychology major, she is currently president of the LCCC Student Government Association and vice president of the college's chapter of Phi Theta Kappa. Marie is also a peer mentor with the First-Year Experience, is an Honors Scholar and was selected to participate in the Bucknell University Summer Program in 2023. She is also a member of the Student Advisory Council for Equity, Inclusion and Belonging. As an international student, Marie took advantage of numerous opportunities to overcome challenges and to be an involved member of the student community. She will graduate from LCCC in May 2024.


The scholarship is named for Rosemary and Lou Oberndorf. Lou co-founded METI, a world leader in medical education technology whose products are used in many community colleges as well as in the world's leading medical schools. He is a member of the Phi Theta Kappa Foundation Board of Trustees.

Up to 15 Oberndorf Lifeline to Completion Scholarships are awarded annually.

Honors Scholar Gains Research Experience with LCCC Grad



Second year Honors Scholar Emma Miller was selected to participate in a research experience at Lehigh University with LCCC Honors Alum, Dane Santa ('19). Dane is currently working toward his Ph.D. in chemistry, and will mentor Emma through the spring semester studying lipid bilayers that model biological membranes.

Emma is using biophysical techniques like quartz crystal microbalance and fluorescence microscopy to examine how lipids involved in immune signaling pathways affect the physical properties of cell membranes. Emma's contributions to this research will help to advance the understanding of lipid membrane structure in many common diseases and immune responses.
